TO FIT SIZES

0-3 months: chest 16in (41cm)

3-6 months: chest 18in (46cm)

6-12months: chest 20in (51cm)

HORNED HAT

Using size 2 (3.25mm) needles and Colour A (white), cast on 21 (25:29) sts; now introduce col B (black) and cast on a further 50 (53:56) sts. There are now 71 (78:85) sts in total.

Work in k1, p1 rib for $\frac{3}{4}$ (1 $\frac{1}{4}$ in :1 $\frac{1}{2}$ in (2 [3:4]cm), working in both colours using the intarsia method (see notes) and ending with wrong side row.

With right side facing change to size 6 (4mm) needles, and work all rows of Hat chart ending with p row.

CROWN SHAPING

Cont in A. (white)

With right side facing, begin crown dec as follows:

1st row: k1, *k2tog, k5; rep from* to end.

2nd row: and every alt row: purl all sts.

3rd row: k1, *k2tog, k4; rep from* to end.

5th row: k1, *k2tog, k3; rep from* to end.

7th row: k1, *k2tog, k2; rep from* to end.

9th row: k1, *k2tog, k1; rep from* to end.

11th row: k1, *k2tog; rep from * to end.

There are 11 (12:13) sts rem.

Break off yarn, then draw it through the rem sts, pull together tightly and fasten off securely.

HORN (make 2)

NOTE: the abbreviations ‘m1’ means make an extra stitch by picking up and knitting the loop between stitches. This makes a decorative hole. Using size 6 (4mm) needles and col C (Brown), cast on 3sts.

1st row: k1, m1, k1, m1, k1.

Next row and every alt row: purl all sts.

3rd Row: k2, m1, k1, m1, k2.

5th Row: k3, m1, k1, m1, k3.

7th Row: k4, m1, k1, m1, k4.

9th Row: k5, m1, k1, m1, k5.

Cont inc 1 st either side of the central stitch until you have 21 sts.

Cont in st st until work measures 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ in (11cm), ending with a wrong side row. Bind off all sts, and fasten off securely.

SEWING TOGETHER THE HAT

* Using a bodkin and matching yarn, sew the hat seam, then weave in all tails of yarn neatly on the reverse side. Join horn seams and stuff lightly.

* To position and sew the cow horns in place, put the hat on a head-sized bowl or similar object.

Pin each horn into position, then sew the cast-on edge securely to the hat using yarn col C.

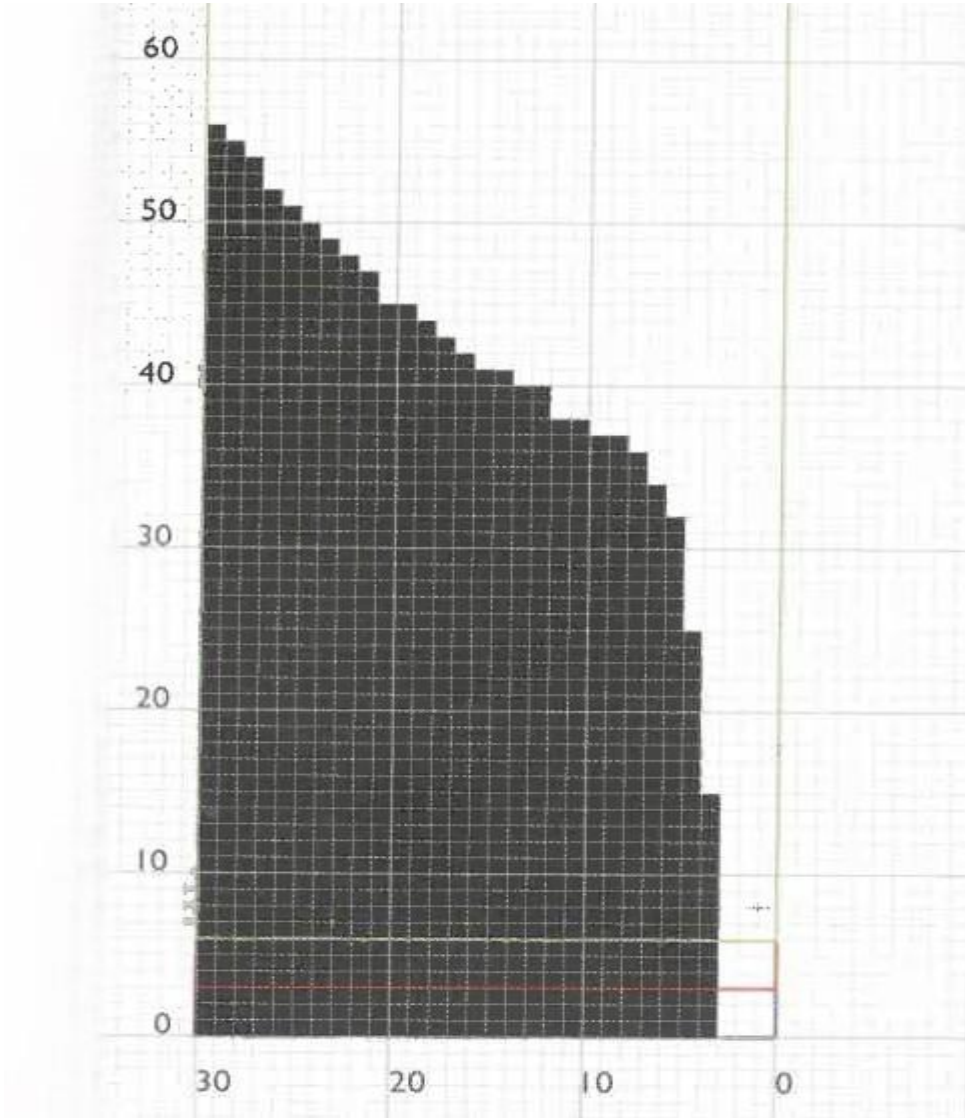

NOTES:

INTARSIA METHOD: This is the neatest method of creating large areas of contrast colour, with no long floats on the reverse side to deal with.

This is especially useful for a baby garment, where those little fingers can become tangles so easily in loose threads. Each area is knitted using a separate ball of yarn, but the yarns are twisted together on the reverse side of each intersection, so that the work holds together on one piece.

EXTRA INFORMATION FOR ENTERING PHOTOGRAPY

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- * Photos will be exhibited only at the discretion of the Steward or the Committee.
- * Entrants are limited to a maximum of THREE entries per class.
- * The steward reserves the right to transfer entries into the correct class if deemed to be entered in the wrong class or section.

EXTRA INFORMATION FOR ENTERING PHOTOGRAPY (Cont)

- * Work previously exhibited at Queanbeyan Show will NOT be accepted.
- * Images can only be entered in one class. Similar images may be entered in another class. This is not advisable as it lessens the initial impact for the judge and impact is a key element in judging photographic competitions.

PRINT SIZE

- * **Acceptable print size:** No LARGER than 30cm x 21cm (A4 size) with border included in this size.

PRINTING

- * Images may be printed using traditional darkroom processes or digitally using inkjet or other processes.
- * Images can be printed by a person other than the photographer but not altered by them except for minor contrast and colour correction.
- * Cropping is permitted but must be done by the photographer submitting the entry or under their direct guidance.
- * **Only photos printed on photo grade paper will be accepted.** No Computer Copy Paper will be allowed.
- * No laminated prints will be accepted.

MOUNTING

- * Photos to be mounted on Black or White HEAVY cardboard around 240gsm or 5mm Foam board, available from Spotlight and Office Works.
- * All photos must be firmly fixed to the cardboard. Any photos that come unfixed will be removed and not displayed. This also applies to images brought in on soft card mounts (e.g. project poster paper).
- * No photos under glass or framed, except by the mount board as described above, will be accepted.

LABELLING

- * All photos are to have the entry tickets attached to the FRONT of the exhibits with section and class number. Owner's name and contact details on the BACK of mounting board. Do not write your name on the front of your entry.

DEFINITIONS

- * **Monochrome** – Images using different shades of a single colour, or grey scale to produce the image. They may include black and white with shades of grey, sepia, blue, green or magenta toned prints or other single colour.
- * **Landscape** – Shows spaces within the world, sometimes vast and unending, but other times microscopic. Images typically capture the presence of nature but can also focus on man-made features or disturbances of landscapes. People should only be incidental to the scene and not the focus or major element in the image.
- * **Any Subject** – Any image. Images entered in other classes cannot also be entered in the Any Subject classes.
